## **PASTOR'S PULSE**

**Rejuvenate** is an interesting word! It carries with it an energetic notion of restoring to a vigorous state or to make fresh or new again. In geography it can mean to renew the erosive power of a stream by uplift or by removal of a barrier in the stream bed. As the seasons change and cool air blows across our faces while we grab our sweaters and jackets, so do we experience life's changes and blows. Perhaps some of us are *like lakes and streams that have dried up, parched reminders of what once was* (Job 4:11), prompting us to seek rejuvenation as we



begin to focus on Thanksgiving in the midst of running on empty in our lives. For some of us this is a time of "needed *rejuvenation*" – recharge or restoration to a vigorous or fresh state or renewal of what has been eroded this year through challenges we have faced. But *rejuvenation* can stir up within us the importance of *gratitude*; for we ought to be grateful that we have God who can rejuvenate us. So as you focus on thanksgiving, I wonder if you are grateful to God who makes rejuvenation available to each of us. Perhaps in the coming weeks – in the midst of "lakes and streams that have dried up" in your life – you will pray this psalm so you can be **rejuvenated** –

GOD, teach me lessons for living so I can stay the course. Give me insight so I can do what you tell me— my whole life one long, obedient response. Guide me down the road of your commandments; I love traveling this freeway! Give me a bent for your words of wisdom, and not for piling up loot. Divert my eyes from toys and trinkets, **invigorate** me on the pilgrim way. Affirm your promises to me— promises made to all who fear you. Deflect the harsh words of my critics— but what you say is always so good. See how hungry I am for your counsel; preserve my life through your righteous ways! Let your love, GOD, shape my life with salvation, exactly as you promised; Then I'll be able to stand up to mockery because I trusted your Word. Don't ever deprive me of truth, not ever— your commandments are what I depend on. Oh, I'll guard with my life what you've revealed to me, guard it now, guard it ever; And I'll stride freely through wide open spaces as I look for your truth and your wisdom; Then I'll tell the world what I find, speak out boldly in public, unembarrassed. I cherish your commandments—oh, how I love them! — relishing every fragment of your counsel. Remember what you said to me, your servant— I hang on to these words for dear life! These words hold me up in bad times; yes, your promises **rejuvenate** me. (**Psalm 119:33-50**)

Please check your pulse in this season as you read *The Pulse* so you can renew the erosive power of your life's stream by uplift or by removal of a barrier in your stream bed! To God be the glory!



In the United States, prematurity/low birthweight is the second leading cause of all infant deaths (during the first year of life) and the leading cause of infant death among African-American infants. Premature birth is the number 1 killer of newborns. Babies born just a few weeks early are at risk of severe health problems and lifelong disabilities.

November is Prematurity Awareness Month® and when the March of Dimes focuses the nation's attention on premature birth. The awareness month kicks off on November 1 with the release of the 2011 Premature Birth Report Card. November 17 marks World Prematurity Day, and the March of Dimes and their partner organizations worldwide are asking everyone to help spread the world on the serious problem of premature birth. Honor the million babies worldwide who died this year because they were born too soon, and the 12 million more who struggle to survive.



According to information from the March of Dimes Perinatal Data Center, the rate of preterm births in the United States is highest among African-American infants at 17.8 percent (18.6 percent in Texas—the highest among any subgroup). To address this disparity, the March of Dimes Texas Chapter launched the Honey Child Prenatal Education Program in 2006. The Honey Child Prenatal Education Program has been designed to provide African-American women with the culturally-appropriate information and support needed to have the healthiest possible pregnancy and birth outcome. The intervention targets African-American women of childbearing age with a specific focus on women ages 17-44. David Chapel is a proud host site of the Honey Child program led by Sis. 

Celebrate Recovery is a program designed to help those struggling with hurts, hang-ups, and habits by showing them the loving power of Jesus Christ through the recovery process. The road to recovery is based on eight recovery principles, based on the Beatitudes.

- Realize I'm not God; I admit that I am powerless to control my tendency to do the wrong thing and that my life is unmanageable. (Step 1) "Happy are those who know that they are spiritually poor."
- Earnestly believe that God exists, that I matter to Him and that He has the power to help me recover. (Step 2) "Happy are those how mourn, for they shall be comforted."
- Consciously choose to commit all my life and will to Christ's care and control. (Step 3) "Happy are the meek."
- Openly examine and confess my faults to myself, to God, and to someone I trust. (Steps 4 and 5) "Happy are the pure in heart."
- Voluntarily submit to any and all changes God wants to make in my life and humbly ask Him to remove my character defects. (Steps 6 and 7) "Happy are those whose greatest desire is to do what God requires"
- Evaluate all my relationships. Offer forgiveness to those who have hurt me and make amends for harm I've done to others when possible, except when to do so would harm them or others. (Steps 8 and 9) "Happy are the merciful."
- Reserve a time with God for self-examination, Bible reading, and prayer in order to know God and His will for my life and to gain the power to follow His will. (Steps 10 and 11)
- Yield myself to God to be used to bring this Good News to others, both by my example and my words. (Step 12) "Happy are those who are persecuted because they do what God requires."




