STAY SAFE IN THE SUMMER HEAT

If you are planning on being outdoors on a hot summer day, you can take simple precautions to keep you and your family members safe from the summer heat. Stay cool and make simple changes in your fluid intake, activities, and clothing during hot

weather to help reduce the risk of hyperthermia and heat stroke.

- Pack your cooler with water, ice and cool packs or cloths. Avoid caffeinated and alcoholic beverages which are diuretics and can dehydrate you.
- Dress for the heat in loose, light colored clothing, wear a hat and use sunscreen.
- Stay hydrated and drink more water than usual, 2 to 4 eight ounce cups of water every hour when outside for long periods of time, and when performing strenuous work or exercise.
- Don't over-exercise, take breaks, and seek the shade or air conditioning to cool yourself down.

SMITH RANKS HIGH IN SPORTS, CLASS WORK

ohn W. Smith Jr. excelled in athletics and academics at Elgin High School, from which he recently graduated, and is aiming for similar achievements in college. Closing out his senior year at the state track and field competitions held at UT, Smith won the bronze medal in the 300-meter hurdles, a race in which he had not participated since he was a freshman. He now holds the fifth best time in that event in Texas. Earlier he placed third in the district in the 200-meter run and the 4x100 meter relay, won first in the long jump, and first in the 300-meter hurdles. Then he advanced to the area meet held in

Brenham and won the 300-meter hurdles and placed second in the long jump. With that performance he advanced to the regional meet at Sam Houston State University, Huntsville. After the awards ceremony at UT Smith received in writing two offers of full scholarships to two area universities.

Ending his senior year, Smith was named the boys track and field MVP, and was chosen for the Wildcat Field Event Award. At the May 12 EISD board meeting he was recognized by the superintendent for his "outstanding accomplishments in representing the Elgin ISD."

At Elgin Smith was a regular honor roll student and was chosen freshman of the year. As a senior he took two dual-credit courses at ACC while working part time. He also played football and the team reached the third round of the playoffs for the first time in vears. The season's last game ended on a questionable

call on a Saturday against Thurgood Marshall High School in the Houston area and Smith went to the hospital for surgery the following Monday to repair a hand injury which he had played with all season. During his last football season Smith was runner-up for the EHS King Cat Award, and won Academic All-District 17-AAAA and All-District 17-AAAA Second-team Corner honors. Upon graduation he was awarded the Gary Snowden Memorial Scholarship.

On May 29 Smith signed with Texas Tech University in Lubbock where he will take part in track and field. He plans to major in sports medicine and earn a Ph.D. He also hopes to compete in the Olympics. Smith's father, John Smith Sr., his siblings, Jordan, Serena and Stephon, and his grandparents, George and Judith Smith, are all DC members. His mother is Rhondolyn Williams and his maternal grandparents are Roy and Johnnie Harris.




