Pastor's Pulse

We are one month away from the end of the year and the beginning of another. God has been good to us! Thank you for your support of our ministries, budgetary commitments and the United We Build (UWB) capital fundraising campaign. You and I

recognize we ought to make equal sacrifices based on the principle of prayerful faithgiving, although we will not give the same amounts.

Your UWB commitment recognizes that our current facilities – in use since 1959 – are inadequate and we have a great need for attractive and adequate facilities to house our ministries, worship and work as a "church with a heart for the community" in the 21st

century and beyond. I was reminded of this on a recent Sunday morning.

As with every Sunday morning, that Sunday there was a lot of jostling in our facilities. At about 9:15 or so, those who had come for Sunday School were preparing for their classes as the 8 a.m. service ended. They needed to use our sanctuary for an adult class. In the fellowship hall – which had been set up for a veterans' display – portable walls had been rolled in to separate the space so the 2-3 classes (young adult and men) could have their study. The Media Ministry was in the same space, preparing for their work. The nearby kitchen was buzzing, so to speak, as our Culinary Ministry prepared for the reception to be held in the same room. In the background, the microphone in the sanctuary broadcasted the voice of the instructor of the adult class and those in the fellowship hall could hear as well. Everyone was talking and had learned to share not only the physical space but the airspace as well because teaching, learning, equipment set-up, and reception preparation had to take place in the same room at the same time.

Our children were in their classes in the educational space of our main building, while an adult class and a youth class were in our portable building. Toward the end of classes in that building, children, youth and their adult workers were waiting to quickly set up the room for Kids & Youth Church, because the space had to be shared and the 40 or so children and youth (and the adult workers) needed to start their 10:30 worship on time. After their worship time they separated into their small group studies. The 25 or so youth group that was to be in the old Relief Nursery House next door had to switch space with the children group because their size was too large for that space; the youth stayed in the portable building. Indeed, we are challenged by the limitations of our spaces on every Sunday morning.

In addition to having space challenges – and I pray our continuing growth will continue to challenge us in that regard – we are involved in an eternal endeavor. Accordingly, we must continue to remind ourselves and other members that our UWB undertaking is not about us but the Lord; and what we do and don't do impacts current and future generations. I'm certain those who paid for our current building had to have the same thought in their mind. Through UWB, we are partnering with the Lord to expand God's kingdom by drawing others – children, teenagers, adults and families – to him, as we make disciples. We need ministries and facilities that adequately allow us to make disciples and minister. Thank you for embracing and financially supporting the vision God has given us.

Our 3-year campaign commitments totaled \$726,020, while our campaign contributions as of October totaled \$370,628. The campaign is set to close on April 27th, the date of our 90th church anniversary. My prayer is that we will get it done. As someone recently jokingly said to me in regarding to our church giving, "the good news is that we have the money to pay for our new facilities; the bad news is that it's still in our pockets." Let's get it out of our pockets and be United (As) We Build to God's glory!



Breakfast Proves to be Important Meal for DC Men

In an effort to continue supporting the whole person, the David Chapel Men's Ministry hosted a breakfast and personal financial seminar presented by Michael De La Fuente, Financial Advisor with Wells Fargo Advisor LLC and the financial advisor for David Chapel. Michael opened by talking about the importance of saving and getting an early start. He also stated that if for some reason you don't get an early start, you still need to save.

Wells Fargo Advisor LLC, while sharing the same brand as the bank is a separate entity solely involved with financial advising. Their model is a little different than the typical industry model. Wells Fargo provides a "bottom up" approach vs. a "top down" approach. They deal directly with each client's personal needs. Michael explained the danger of relying on "general advice."

People save and invest for different reasons. Some save to continue their current lifestyle in retirement. Some save to travel and enjoy life. Other save to grow wealth to pass on to the next generation. There are a number of tools for investment such as stocks, bonds, metals, and CDs. Choosing the right mix of investment tools is very important. The amount of gains is often related to the amount of risk. While many lost double digits in their stock value in 2008, the market overall is up more than 100 percent since the end of the recession.


Michael showed a chart that demonstrated that saving as little as \$50.00 a month with 6 percent return could be \$194,384 in 17 years. He told the audience that every household should have a minimum of six months household expenses saved in cash. This would cover you in the loss of a job or long term illness.

A question and answer session followed the presentation. The interest level was high enough that a follow up session is being planned for early next year.
