

MEXAUSTIN Scholarship Application Deadline: April 30, 2016

The Consulate General of Mexico in Austin, in collaboration with local nonprofit Foundation Communities, is pleased to announce that the MEXAUSTIN Scholarship application is now available at <u>MexAustin.com</u>. Students entering college for the first time in the fall of 2016 are eligible to apply. In order to qualify for the scholarship, students must have at least a 2.5

high school GPA, be first- or second-generation Mexican or other Latino immigrants and live within the Consulate's jurisdiction (includes Travis and surrounding counties). The program plans to award \$1,000 scholarships to 140 students. Additional details about the scholarship are available at <u>MexAustin.com</u>.

Since the MEXAUSTIN Scholarship application cannot be submitted without completing a financial aid form (FAFSA or TAFSA), Foundation Communities offers in-person help with the financial aid process at their Community Financial Centers in North and South Austin. THE CONTINUAL STRUGGLE BY BRIAN WASHINGTON

The Continual Struggle is artist Brian Washington's artwork documenting the Civil Rights Movement and America's historic struggle against segregation and other forms of race-based disenfranchisement. The exhibit uses visual

art as an educational tool and method of storytelling, vividly illustrating people who were willing to go into the streets to protest injustice and inequality. Carefully researched and drawn only in black and white, the stark drawings portray sharecropping, non-violent protest, freedom rides, marches, voter registration campaigns, police violence, and the realities that provoked those actions – vividly demonstrating the conflict-ridden nature of social change.



After Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated on April 4, 1968, President Johnson wrote a letter of condolence to his widow, Coretta Scott King. In the typed letter, dated April 5, 1968, Johnson writes, "We will overcome this calamity and continue the work of justice and love that is Martin Luther King's legacy and trust to us." Johnson wrote of his determination to find King's killer.

The letter from President Johnson to Mrs. King will make its public museum debut at the LBJ Library. It has been donated to the Library by a private collector for the permanent collection. In recognizing the importance of the letter, LBJ Library Director Mark K. Updegrove said, "It is an extraordinarily valuable piece of American history. Johnson's words capture the anguish of a nation at the death of Dr. King and express resolve in following King's dream of equal rights for all."

The LBJ Library (2313 Red River, Austin, 78705) is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Admission prices vary, but admission is free on the upcoming Presidents Day holiday and other holidays.
