

Brandon, a Ph.D. student at the University of Texas at Austin, and leader of Think Kingdom Austin, attended and provided insight from Birdman's interview, "Are you finished or are you done?" and challenged us to recognize that Jesus is the true vine (John 15:1). The similar, rhetorical questions of Birdman suggests that, in a spiritual context, there is only one answer, one way, and one truth-Jesus!

On Saturday, after a great breakfast and brief stretching (to wake us up), we were greeted by Officer Tarver, who talked to us about police interaction, gangs, underage drinking and smoking, and dangers of the internet and social media.
