In an effort to get our students thinking about future academic and career goals, and to foster adult and youth relationships in the church and beyond, the Youth ministry launched the "iAM a Mentor" one-day program this summer. According to Lifeway, there are 12 things teens need to know about their faith and, through our efforts, we focused on priorities (#4) and values (#5). Approximately 17

youth, over half of our students, were matched with an adult mentor and the majority of them spent quality time with their mentor this summer. Youth were matched based on their favorite subjects and desired career path. Mentors were selected from a wide range of industries to include the military, law, education, engineering, business, and music. Those who have not spent time together are encouraged and expected to do so this academic year.

The program culminated at the "iAM a Mentor" Brunch held at David Chapel on Saturday, August 6<sup>th</sup>. Each mentor and mentee that attended the brunch was given an opportunity to speak about their experiences together. Keith Overton-Hadnot introduced one of his mentors, Eric Narcisse, who highlighted the importance of being a mentor, and one of his mentees, Caleb Davis, who shared his experience as a mentee. Dr. Colette Pierce Burnette, the keynote speaker, urged students to take advantage of their mentorship and noted how she benefited from her mentors. "My mentors stretched me into places I needed to be," says Dr. Burnette.

#### DAVID CHAPEL VOTER REGISTRATION CAMPAIGN

The 2016 Presidential Election is **TUESDAY**, **NOVEMBER 8**, **2016**. Early voting is Monday, October 24 through Friday, November 4, 2016.

To ensure you are eligible to vote, you need to do the following:

- 1. Register to vote by October 11, 2016.
- 2. If necessary, update your current voter registration card by October 11, 2016. (new last name, change of address, etc.)
- 3. Have a current photo identification approved by the State of Texas by October 1, 2016. Your name on the photo ID must match the name on the voter registration list.
- 4. Apply for an exemption if you are disabled and have no approved form of ID.

Texas voter registration applications are located in the foyer. Fill out the application completely, sign, date and drop it in the mail. No postage is necessary.

Voting campaign representatives will register individuals every Sunday after worship service during the month of September in the Fellowship Hall.

## SOME TEXAS VOTERS CAN VOTE FROM HOME BY MAIL BALLOT

Texas statute allows voters to vote by mail if you fit one of the following criteria:

- Will be 65 years of age on election day.
- Will be out of their county of residence during the entire Early Voting period and on Election Day.
- Has a disability (as defined by the applicant).
- Is confined to a jail but eligible to vote.

People over 65 years of age and individuals with disabilities may apply for an Annual Ballot at any time. You may complete this application and mail it to your Election Clerk now. Ballots can be obtained from the County Clerk of your residence no later than the close of business 11 days before election day - Friday, Oct. 28, 2016.

In Travis County, you can obtain an application for a mail ballot requesting through e-mail (<u>election@traviscountytx.gov</u>), the Travis County Clerk website (<u>www.traviscountyclerk.org/eclerk/Content.do?code=E.8</u>) or by calling 512/238-8683. You do not have to use a formal application; however, an informal application must be in writing and include:

- Your signature (or a witness' signature if you cannot sign);
- Your name and the address at which you are registered to vote;
- The address to which the ballot is to be mailed;
- The election date and for which election you are requesting a ballot (for a primary election, you must state the political party's primary in which you wish to vote); and,
- A reason why you are eligible to vote early by mail (to be eligible to vote early
  due to a planned absence from the county, your application must state an
  address out-of-county to have your ballot mailed and the dates that you are outof-county).

In Williamson County, you can obtain information about mail in ballot by calling (512) 943-1630. This information was obtained from the Travis County Clerk website.
